## Esso Demolition Update.

Demolition of the old Esso building is moving quickly. We are disappointed we have not had a lot of interaction or timelines from the demolition team, although we note barbed wire above the security wall has occurred due to trespassers entering the site. A lot of the internal of the building has now been removed with the main structure soon to be covered with dust tarps before demolition of these areas.

## Building Security

It is crucial for everyone to promptly report any lost, missing, or stolen keys, fobs or remotes. Management can easily deactivate reported access passes.

We kindly remind everyone **NOT** to leave valuables, keys or remotes inside your vehicles.

A really easy one - make sure those entering the lift with you swipe a floor. If they don't, then let concierge know as soon as possible. They may be tailgaters and our team can quickly follow them up.!

## Furniture Deliveries/Goods Lift Booking

Moving large items such as furniture, appliances, or big boxes in the normal lifts is strictly prohibited. A goods lift booking is required to take these items to your apartment.

## Electronic Transportation Devices (ETD)

Due to recent apartment fires caused by Lithium batteries, the Owners Corporation will look at some new rules focusing on charging ETD's in apartments. In the meantime, we request you follow the recommendations below:

Periodically check your devices and batteries for any signs of damage, such as swelling or leakage and cease use if they show any characteristics out of the ordinary, i.e. overheating, erratic flashing of charging lights or physical damage.

Replace an ETD battery with a new battery manufactured for that particular ETD and purchased from a reputable manufacturer or authorized dealer. Use only the provided or recommended chargers for your devices. Do not overcharge your battery and unplug your device once fully charged. Do not use damaged, outdated, third-party batteries not manufactured for that particular ETD.

## Car Park Speed Limit

The speed limit for vehicles in the car park is 5km/hr. Yellow lines and speed bumps are installed to deter speeding, yet disregard for the speed limit and staying on your side of the drive are frequent. Please respect all those who are using the car park. Stay to the left side of the drive and drive **slowly**. A recent collision resulted in significant vehicle damage and we have had near pedestrian misses.



There is no rush. Please drive carefully, watch out for pedestrians walking and crossing, and stay to the left of the lane as much as you can for safety reasons.

## Community

### Items left in car spaces

For insurance and fire hazard reasons, storing or leaving items in your car space is prohibited and is against the Owners Corporations rules.

If you have a small vehicle and depending on your car park location, a Spacemate might be a good idea. Otherwise, there are storage cages available to rent.

### Rubbish Chute

A gentle reminder to all residents that the rubbish chute is designated solely for bagged rubbish. Large items such as cardboard, pillows and doona's should not be disposed of through the chute. These items can lead to severe blockages, requiring extensive time and effort for our cleaners to resolve.

If the cleaners are unable to unblock the chute, then an external contactor is required. This cost will be covered by the resident.

### Gym Induction

 Prior to having access to the gym and other facilities of the building, a resident must first undergo a mandatory gym induction. This is being held every Monday evening, 7PM (unless a public holiday). Our dedicated resident and gym instructor, **Lesley Maxwell**, will gather everyone in the foyer before heading up to level 10 to commence the induction.

Access to facilities will then be granted to resident's access pass the following day.

### Grocery Deliveries

Residents **MUST** be home to receive grocery deliveries, as these cannot be left in front of the door. Please instruct the delivery drivers to head to the Loading Dock in Cook St. where security can assist them in taking the grocery items to you.

If no one is home when the delivery comes, the items will be returned and you will have to reschedule.

### Car Park Pedestrian Doors / Car Park Alarms

Please avoid using the car park main entry and exit doors when traveling by foot. These doors are equipped with alarms that are triggered by pedestrian traffic.

Instead, please utilize the designated pedestrian door.

This will significantly reduce the frequency of alarm triggers, and will greatly help concierge and security in identifying any unauthorized individuals tailgating vehicles.
