#### **Illegally Parking**



Please **DO NOT** illegally park in

someone else's car parking space. Towing can be organised by a resident without notifying Building Management.

It is inconvenient and very expensive to retrieve your vehicle if towed.

### **Smoking**

There have been many complaints regarding smoke smells penetrating apartments and lingering in common areas. It is in breach of the Owners Corporation Act Model Rule 1.4 which states:



Smoke Penetration—A lot owner or occupier in a multilevel development must ensure that smoke caused by the smoking of tobacco or any other substance by the owner or occupier, or any invitee of the owner or occupier, on the lot does not penetrate to the common property or any other lot.

Cigarette butts thrown from balconies and landing on other balconies is a potential fire hazard. Those who choose to empty their ashtrays onto the car park floor—well that behaviour is totally disrespectful. If caught, breaches and fines will be imposed.



All smokers—please empathise with those who do not smoke and/or just wish to live in a clean and healthy environment.

If you witness someone smoking and throwing cigarette butts in car spaces, please contact concierge on 9685 0188 and Security will immediately attend. There are many children, elderly and others with health conditions who live in the building—please be respectful of others.

#### **Pool Terrace Works Level 9**

It has been recommended by the contractors to keep Level 9 (Pool Terrace) closed until the work to this area has been completed. This is due to the potential risk of damage to the new membrane that has been recently applied to the area.

Once completed, the area will contain some greenery (plants etc), decking, a grassed area and fixed seating.

We appreciate your patience and hope to have the area opened soon for all to enjoy.

## **Chute Blockages**

Recently, loose foam, large bags of clothing, loose paper, and similar materials have been removed from the chute, causing blockages. Please ensure that only **small**, **sealed plastic bags** are



placed into the chute. If you are uncertain whether an item is too large, then it most likely is.

Large and loose items are to be brought directly to the basement and placed into the larger bins. Residents who improperly use the chute will be breached and invoiced for any resulting blockages. Recycling bins are available on every level, along with an E-waste bin, a charity bin, and arrangements for hard waste disposal.

## **Drone Reports**

Flying drones around the building is prohibited— it is a security and privacy breach, as well as dangerous with helicopters landing near the river. Drones can only be used in designated areas.
