Cinema Renovation.

Your pet and common property

Your pet **MUST** always be on a lead when walking through common property including the foyer and car park. If unable to walk on a lead, it must be carried.



When entering an occupied lift, please ask those already in the lift if they are comfortable travelling with your pet. Not everyone is comfortable being in a confined space with a pet. That's OK. Just take the next



Clean up after your pet if it makes a mess in any common area.. This includes urinating or defecation in

the car park. The Owners Corporation

has the right to have your pet removed from the premises if it is causing a nuisance. This behaviour is a nuisance!

Smoking & Disposal of Cigarettes Butts

New Owners Corporation Rules note that ANY smoke that penetrates the common area or another lot is in breach of the rules. This includes smoke transfer to another apartment while smoking on a balcony.

To avoid issues with your neighbours, it is strongly recommended you go outside the building for a cigarette.

If you must smoke on a balcony, please ensure your cigarette butt is out and is disposed of in an ashtray and immediately emptied to ensure the butt is not blown away. It is an offence to litter.

DO NOT throw cigarette butts over your balcony as this is a fire hazard.
