## **Main Foyer Furniture**

As well as a great looking foyer, we now have some lovely furniture. This furniture has been loaned to Eureka Tower free of charge by King Living, located on the corner of Cook Street and City Road, Southbank.

This furniture will be on loan until the new ordered furniture arrives which is expected to be end of March 2019. Thank you King Living.

#### **Motorbike Helmets**

For security reasons, persons wearing motorbike helmets will not be permitted to enter the building unless their helmet is removed and left with concierge.



We request all residents advise their delivery drivers to remove their helmets when having deliveries. Unfortunately, if this is not adhered to, there may be more stricter requirements required, so it would be great if everyone could assist with this new requirement.

Those wearing helmets may be refused entry or may be told to exit the building if their motorbike helmet is not removed prior to entry.

## **Intercom Upgrade**

Intercom replacements, testing and commissioning of the new intercom system are at their final stages.

If you are having any issues with your intercom, please advise Concierge in writing so we can address before the contractors finalise.

# **Eureka Tower Cladding**

With the recent events involving flammable cladding on high rise apartment buildings, we would like to advise all residents Eureka Tower has been declared safe by the VBA, the City of Melbourne and the MFB.

The Eureka Tower committee had the external cladding of the building checked as soon as flammable cladding was first raised with a letter of compliance issued by the VBA in November 2016.

#### Cigarette butts and other items over balconies

Cigarette butts or any other items are not to be discarded over balconies. They create a fire risk and a danger to those below. Please use ashtrays with a lid, then remove it from your balcony when you are finished. Please disregard any rubbish wisely and keep your balconies clear.

#### Storing items in the car park

Your car parking space is for your vehicle and not for storing other items. Please keep your car space free of stored items due to fire risk and to maintain the aesthetics and cleanliness of the car park.

Those storing items in their car park, will soon be notified.

#### **Foyer Doors**

The following times are set for the new air lock doors.

External door is locked from 7pm—7am. Swipe to enter the air lock and swipe again to enter the main fover.

Security may also be activated during high security risk events e.g. White Night, or high wind events.

Otherwise internal sliding door is sensor activated to exit unless in an emergency.

#### **Building Security over Christmas & New Year**

Increased security throughout the building and cooperation of residents and their visitors resulted in no incidents reported for Christmas and New Years Eve celebrations.

## **Owners Corporation Rules**

Every strata titled building in Victoria must comply with the Model Rules set by the Owners Corporation Act 2006.

In addition to these rules, Eureka Tower has its own set of Additional Rules. These are over and above the Model Rules.

We request all residents in the building abide by the model rules and Additional rules set by Eureka Tower.

They are in place to ensure the peaceful enjoyment of all in the building, and to ensure the security and safety of the building is upheld.

#### Packages & Mail

Over 100 packages as well as mail deliveries are received each day and processed as quickly as possible. Residents are advised of package deliveries by placing a slip in your mailbox.

Whilst you may receive delivery notification via sms or email from the courier, please wait until receiving the slip in your mail box before going to Concierge to pick up your item as this slip is required for identification purposes.

#### **Car Park Thefts**

Even though Eureka Tower has very good security measures in place, we are still not 100% secure from thefts, especially in the car park.

We recommend the following actions:

 Use a good 'D' lock on all bicycles, whether they are on a bike rack or in the secure bicycle storage area.
The option of the secure bicycle storage facility located ed in the basement for \$150 pa—some spaces available

Bicycles are not permitted in the building, through the foyer or in the lifts. Doing so is in breach of the Owners Corporation rules.

- Fit your motorbike with a tracking device and perhaps a back wheel lock to make it more difficult to move.
- Lock your storage unit with a high quality padlock. It is surprising how many car park storage units are left unlocked.
- Lock your vehicles and remove expensive items from view. Take all keys with you.
